## **Our GRAND KNIGHT'S Message**

Brothers,

What a fun first few months it has been serving the brothers of #4188, our parishes, and all of those in need. It was an honor being nominated and elected as your Grand Knight. I view myself as a "servant leader" to all of you. I welcome any and all feedback and suggestions you might have. I empower you to be a leader and help make our council better than it was yesterday. And, I look forward to continuing to serve you and our Lord.

Since the start of our fiscal year, we have been doing a lot of good works as part of our "Faith and Action" program and I would like to touch on the activities we have done.



"Faith" – We have set up "roundtable" coordinators at GA, COL, and SEAS. These individual's meet with the Pastor's on behalf of #4188 and understand the needs of our parish. This has led to our brothers helping at various events. I personally feel that we are involved more than ever in all three parishes. Another item I want to touch on is our vocations. In November, we approved \$1,000 to be given to two seminarians. As you are aware, supporting our priests (and future priests) is a top priority.

"Family" – Every other month, we donate \$900 (\$300 to each parish) to St. Vincent de Paul to help provide food to families in need. We also support "Keep Christ in 'Christ'mas" and recognizing families that perform wonderful deeds in His name.

"Community" – The biggest contribution we have made in the category has been our "Coat's for Kids" campaign. We donated a total of \$1,500 in coats to those in need. We have also supported Oktoberfest at GA, the Bishop Foley Alumni, GA Catholic School, and many others. In all, we have donated items or supported 11 different groups. We even donated teddy bears to children at Children's Hospital.

"Life" – Every life is valuable and treasured by Him, even those that are unborn. We have increased our attention in supporting "Mother and Unborn Baby Care," the "Right to Life" dinner, and the "Baby Bottle" programs at our council meetings.

We support these causes in two main ways. First, we volunteer thousands of man hours to raise money through working fish fry, BINGO, 4<sup>th</sup> of July parking, and the list goes on. Second, if we can't volunteer, we support the functions by eating fish, attending the Foley Golf Outing, attending Oktoberfest, joining in for a Council bus trip to Greek Town, etc.

Without you, we wouldn't exist. Thank you all for your continued support of our mission.



## Donated bike cart gives Clawson family freedom

"CLAWSON — On Aug. 28, the Clawson Knights of Columbus presented a local family with a custom bike cart during their weekly bingo night.

For the last three years, the Smith family hasn't been able to go on family bike rides. Debbie said she reached out on Facebook to inquire about ways to raise funds...

...That was when Carol Reeser, of Madison Heights, saw the post. Her husband, John Reeser, served as a former grand knight with the local Knights of Columbus group. "I said, 'Don't even do that. Let me ask the Knights, and let me talk to John.' They said, 'Oh, consider it done.' It was just a matter of asking," Reeser said. "We've known the (Smith family) for a very long time. That's why this is so emotional. They're a very special family." The Smiths and the Reesers both attend Guardian Angels Catholic Church, one of three parishes served by the local Knights of Columbus group.

Adam Rada, the recently elected grand knight, said that the council unanimously approved the purchase of the \$800 bicycle cart for the Smith family."

**UPDATE YOUR BENEFICIARIES!** 

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs.


